A&S grade requirements

A&S Program Requirements: "D" grade (not D-) or higher required to fulfill A&S program requirements.

Major/Minor/Certificate: "C" grade (not C-) or higher in each course. See department for GPA requirements.

Credit/No Credit: All courses used to fulfill requirements must be taken with the letter grade (A-F) option, unless the course is designated mandatory Credit/No Credit. Credit/No Credit option is limited to elective courses only.

Apply for graduation 1-2 semesters prior to your semester of graduation*

Non-Introductory credits are from UHM courses 300-level and above, or 200-level with an explicitly stated college-level course pre-requisite (transfer credits subject to evaluation).
