- With/without insurance
- Undocumented citizens

### INITIAL PROBLEMS

- Big Island equipped with limited resources
- Prior to 2015, no available Suboxone or Buprenorphine waived prescribers
- W.HI one of the highest rates of opioid use in the state

### RESPONSE

2016: Expansion of services for substance use treatment/recovery with help from a HRSA grant and destigmatizing addiction

### WORK

(SASE) → Substance (Ab)Use Service Expansion Program

Providing a system of treatment:

- Monitoring Rx history & dosing
- Clinicians assessment of problem origin
- Creating treatment plan
- Referral to intensive treatment intervention

### Medication Assisted Treatment

- Buprenorphine
- Naloxone (Narcan)
- Naltrexone

### SIGNIFICANCE

- Ongoing collaboration with other providers locally & inter-island
- Serving the W.HI population with a continuum of services in substance use treatment

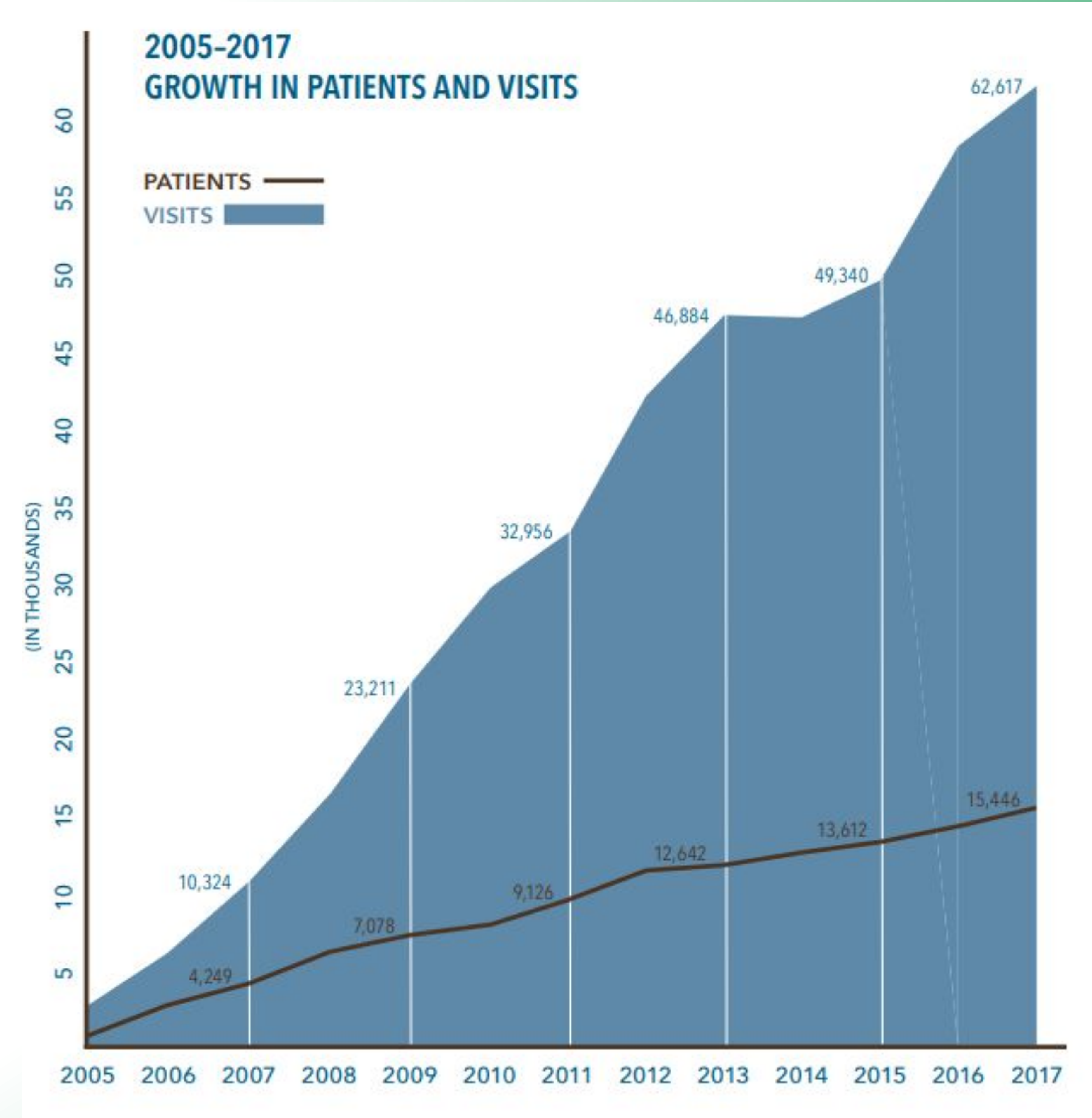
- Largest of the Hawaiian islands, WHCHC serves the West side (Kailua-Kona) of Hawai'i

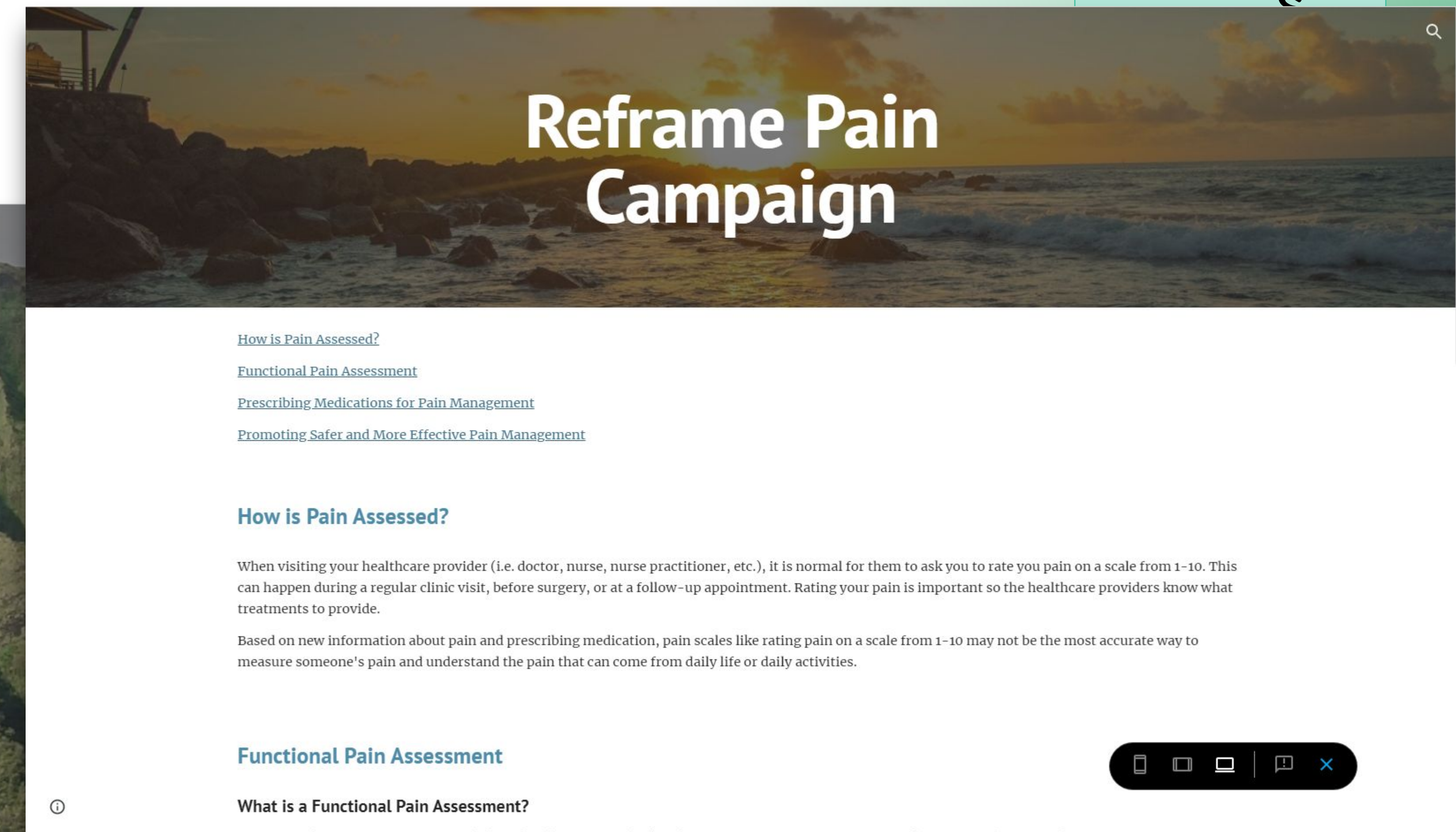
