

Project Spotlight: Photography Curriculum

The 4-H Photography Curriculum comes in three (3) different levels—Focus on Photography, Controlling the Image, and Mastering Photography. Youth will need access to a film-based or digital camera. The curriculum is easily adaptable to use a smart phone with a photo app.

Focus on Photography, Level 1: Youth will focus on equipment basics, taking pictures, and the concepts of lighting and flash. For K-4th grade.

Controlling the Image, Level 2: Youth will explore depth of field, aperture and shutter speeds, hard and soft lighting, silhouettes, and flash techniques. For K-8th grade. Mastering Photography, Level 3: Youth will gain insight on the use of wide-angle and telephoto lenses, filters and special film, light meters, and shooting photos with different light sources. For K-8th grade.

These project books are designed for youth to explore and complete under the guidance of a project helper. The helper can be a parent, relative, 4-H project leader, friend, or knowledgeable adult.

Youth can participate in the Photography Project and be able to enter their photos in the upcoming Oahu County 4-H Communications Fair in Spring 2019! The <u>Photography Curriculum</u> is available as a set of 3 or individual booklets from <u>shop4-h.org</u>.
