Project Spotlight: Woodworking

Our curriculum will help you teach youth specific woodworking skills such as how to measure angles, how to use a circular and table arm saw, and how to sand & stain wood.

Level 1: Measuring Up—Youth will develop skills that woodworkers use, such as measuring, squaring & cutting a board, driving nails, and using clamps and screws. It is suggested that all youth begin with this guide to be grounded in the basics of woodworking. Grades 2-4.

Level 2: Making the Cut—Youth will measure, cut, sand, drill, use advanced hand and power tools, apply finish, and use bolts and staples. Grades 4 - 6.


Level 3: Nailing It Together—Youth will practice measuring angles, cutting dado and rabbet joints, using saws, and smoothing lumber with a hand planer. Grades 6 - 8.

Level 4: Finishing Up—Youth will learn specific woodworking skills including using a router, portable planer and jointer, making a blind mortise and

tenon joint, making dovetail joints, and experimenting with adhesives and various chemical wood strippers. Grades 9 -12.
