NOTES:

Students who take both 301 and 302 must pass a minimum of 37 credits to fulfill the major requirements; students who test out of 301 must pass a minimum of 33 credits, and those who test out of additional advanced language courses must pass a minimum of 31 credits.

Advanced language skill courses (JPN301 to 407 and JPN415, JPN420 and JPN421) are normally limited to non-native speakers of Japanese. Students who place out of the advanced language courses normally choose additional electives to fulfill the 31 credits required for the major. These electives should be chosen in consultation with an adviser

At least 16 of the 31 required credits must be taken within the University of Hawaii system, or else through a study abroad or exchange program administered by a unit of the University of Hawaii (e.g., the Study Abroad Center, the Center for Japanese Studies, etc.).

All courses must be taken for a letter grade and must be passed with a grade of "C" or better in order to be applicable toward the fulfillment of the major requirements.

Prerequisites for all Japanese courses must be passed with a "C" or better. They may also be waived with the consent of the instructor.

All Japanese majors are required to consult with their faculty adviser or the Academic Adviser (Moore 390) prior to registering for each semester. Also, all students contemplating application into our graduate program are advised to discuss their plans with their adviser(s).
