

REQUIREMENTS FOR THE CERTIFICATE IN CHINESE

Five of the following courses, totaling at least 15 credits, must be taken:

CHN 301-302 (or 303*)	Third-Level Mandarin (3-3 [or 6]) (Pre: 202)
CHN 311-312	Mandarin Conversation (3-3) (Pre: 202)
CHN 319	Chinese Dialect Studies (variable) (Pre: Consent)
CHN 331**	Web-Based Advanced Chinese Listening and Writing (3) (Pre: 301 or concurrent)
CHN 332**	Web-Based Advanced Chinese Reading and Writing (3) (Pre: 301 or concurrent)
CHN 401-402 (or 404*)	Fourth-Level Mandarin (3-3 [or 6]) (Pre: 302)
CHN 411-412	Advanced Mandarin Conversation (3-3) (Pre: 302)
CHN 421B,C	Chinese Translation (3) (Pre: 402)
CHN 441	Web-Based Fourth Year Reading and Writing: Advanced Topics I (3) (Pre: 401 or consent)
CHN 442	Web-Based Fourth Year Reading and Writing: Advanced Topics II (3) (Pre: 401 or 441 or consent)
CHN 453	Study of Chinese Characters (3) (Pre: 402 and 461)
CHN 461	Introduction to Classical Chinese (3) (Pre: 302)
CHN 485	Chinese for Academic and Professional Purposes I (3) (Pre: 402)
CHN 486	Chinese for Academic and Professional Purposes II (3) (Pre: 485)
CHN 487B,C,D	Readings in 20 th Century Chinese Literature (3) (Pre: 485 or 486)
CHN 491	Oral Fluency Through Chinese Films (3) (402)

*Chinese 204, 303 and 404 are accelerated versions of 201-202, 301-302 and 401-402, respectively, and are each counted as two courses.

**Chinese 331 and 332 are each repeatable once, but only one of each may be used towards the fulfillment of these requirements.

NOTES:

- 1) Students may take up to two 200-level language courses (201 (4) and 202 (4), or equivalent)
- 2) Students must take at least three 300+ courses from the approved course list (check with the department).
- 3) All courses must be taken for a letter grade, and must be passed with a grade of C or better. In addition, the GPA for the courses together must be 2.5 or higher.
- 4) All courses must be taken within the University of Hawaii system (with at least three taken at UH-Manoa), or else through a study abroad or exchange program which is directly administered by an official UH-Manoa organ (e.g., the Study Abroad Center) and which is officially recognized by the Chinese Section of UHM's Department of East Asian Languages and Literatures.
