The University of Hawai'i at Mānoa (UHM) is pleased to introduce the *Hoakipa* Scholarship Program to international universities who wish to send non-degree-seeking undergraduate and graduate students to UHM for one or two semesters of study. Students enrolled at current UHM partner universities are already eligible for the *Hoakipa* Scholarship.

The *Hoakipa* Scholarship Program is administered by Mānoa International Exchange (MIX). Applications are due by September 15 for Spring semester enrollment (January-May) or by April 1 for Fall semester enrollment (August-December).

"*Hoakipa*" is a Hawaiian word for "visitor" ("*hoa*" is "friend" and "*kipa*" is "to visit"). *Hoakipa* students receive a 15% tuition scholarship that reduces their nonresident tuition, and they have all the rights and privileges afforded international exchange students.

Introducing the ***Hoakipa* Scholarship Program** (For non-degree-seeking international students)

The University of Hawai‘i at Mānoa (UHM) is pleased to introduce the ***Hoakipa* Scholarship Program** to international universities who wish to send non-degree-seeking undergraduate and graduate students to UHM for one or two semesters of study. Students enrolled at current UHM partner universities are already eligible for the ***Hoakipa* Scholarship**.

Applications are due by September 15 for Spring semester enrollment (January-May) or by April 1 for Fall semester enrollment (August-December). The program is administered by the Mānoa International Exchange (MIX) program (http://manoa.hawaii.edu/international/mix/inbound_students/).

“***Hoakipa***” is a Hawaiian word for “visitor” (“*Hoa*” is “friend” and “*kipa*” is “to visit”). This program enables UH Mānoa to accept a significantly larger number of non-degree-seeking international students than we currently accept through our traditional student exchanges.

Hoakipa students will send their application materials, including the \$70 application fee, to Mānoa International Exchange (http://manoa.hawaii.edu/international/mix/inbound_students/) and this office will serve as their primary point of contact at UHM and as the initial liaison between the applicant and the UHM academic department or program. Undergraduate applications will be processed by the Office of Admissions; graduate applications will be processed by Graduate Admissions. ***Hoakipa*** students will have all the rights and privileges afforded international exchange students. We expect to be able to guarantee on-campus housing for Spring semester for ***Hoakipa*** applicants.

Hoakipa students will receive a 15% tuition scholarship that will reduce the nonresident tuition they will pay. Nonresident tuition for 2012-13 is \$12,456/semester, so the ***Hoakipa* Scholarship** is \$1868/semester and students pay \$10,588/semester. In addition to tuition, student fees total about \$350/semester and living expenses are estimated to be \$7,750/semester.
