Applicants who have completed an articulated A.A. degree from a UH Community College are considered to have met the UHM General Education Core Requirements with possible exceptions (see an academic advisor). Once you are admitted to the College of Education, you are required to verify with a College of Education OSAS advisor when you have completed one of the following degrees (if applicable): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> AAT from Leeward Community College AS in Human Services w/Early Childhood Specialization from Maui College AA in Elementary Education & Special Education Dual Preparation Track from Kapi`olani Community College PRAXIS I (PPST/C-PPST): Minimal state passing scores in reading, writing, and mathematics subtests. 40 hours of documented current group leadership involvement with elementary-aged youth. Personal admissions interview. Note: PRAXIS II Content Knowledge Test(s): must be passed with minimal State passing score(s) in subject area(s) to qualify for Student Teaching Residency.
