SUBJECT: INFORMATION ITEM: REPORT ON CENTERS, 2008-2009

In accordance with Board and Executive policy, I am pleased to transmit a report on the status of centers, institutes, and similar organizational units within the University. As the University has become more entrepreneurial and active in seeking and securing grants, the interest in establishing centers that focus on a specific area or a strategic thrust of a college, school, or department has increased.

This is the ninth annual report shared with the Board. This report identifies centers that are new, ongoing, or terminated. Excluding organized research institutes, administrative service centers, and distance learning centers, the University system houses 105 centers with research, instruction, and/or public service purposes.

Most of the centers (105) are a part of the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa (83 or 79%); UH Hilo has 12 (11%) centers, the UH Community Colleges have a total of 9 (9%), and UH West O'ahu has 1 (1%). Details are provided in the attached *Report on UH Centers*.

During 2008-2009 three centers were created, two at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa, the *Hawai'i Law Policy Center* and the *Hawai'i Center for AIDS* and one at Maui College, the *Sustainable Living Institute of Maui*. One center, the *Center for Economic Education*, was terminated at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa.

The Chancellors and I would be pleased to respond to questions at the Board's convenience.

Introduction

In accordance with Board of Regents Policy, Section 5-6 Establishment and Review of Centers (and Institutes) and Executive Policy E5.215, this annual report updates the Board on centers that are new, continuing, or terminated during the 2008-2009 academic year.

Centers focus University expertise in research, instruction, or public service in a specific discipline. They are a means by which the University accomplishes its mission to serve the state and provide leadership nationally and internationally in selected areas. Organized research institutes, administrative service centers, and UH distance learning centers are **not** part of this report.

The BOR policy states that centers require BOR approval only when they: "(1) require significant current or future commitments of institutional funding, personnel, or physical resources, a substantive change in program mission, and/or involve major institutional liability; (2) involve Board or Presidential agreements with external governmental or private entities; and/or (3) involve an honorific name in the designation of the center." All other centers may be approved by the President, who, in turn, has delegated authority to the Chancellors and allowed delegation to lower administrative levels. Chancellors are responsible for maintaining a master list of centers for their campus.

For the academic year 2008-2009, there were 105 centers at the University of Hawai'i. Of the total, 31 (30%) were approved by the Board; the rest were approved at various administrative levels to carry out the requirements of funded legislative mandates or to implement the conditions of grants and contracts.

Eighty-three (79%) of the centers are affiliated with UH Mānoa. Of these, 36 (43%) have a research focus; 11 (13%) a public service focus; 3 (4%) focus on instruction, and 33 (40%) have multiple purposes. Of the 12 centers at UH Hilo, 4 (33%) have a public service focus, 2 (17%) have an instructional focus and 6 (50%) have multiple purposes. The nine centers at the UH Community Colleges are classified as 3 (33%) instructional, 3 (33%) as public service, and 3 (33%) have multiple purposes. The one at UH West O'ahu is a multi-purpose center.

During 2008-2009 three centers were created, two at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa, the *Hawai'i Law Policy Center* and the *Hawai'i Center for AIDS* and one at Maui College, the *Sustainable Living Institute of Maui*. One center, the *Center for Economic Education*, was terminated at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa.
