Removal of SLOs:

- 1. The original SLO 1 was changed to an introductory statement for all outcomes. After extensive discussion during the assessment process, the faculty determined that the SLO 1 was already being operationalized and assessed through the other SLOs, particularly SLOs 1-4. The numbering of the remaining SLOs was changed to reflect the removal of SLO 1.
- 2. The original SLO 9 was changed to be an additional goal. It was determined that this statement was very broad and better suited as a goal for students after graduation, rather than a specific learning outcome.

Changes to the wording of the SLOs:

- 3. SLO 7 was revised based on SLS faculty's knowledge of language-learning opportunities and practices in K-12 and post-secondary education, and job opportunities and expectations.
  - *Previous SLO*: "be able to prepare minority language students to acquire the academic literacies that will allow them to succeed in educational institutions."
  - Changed to: "be able to support language minority students' development of academic and/or professional literacies."

Changes to the course numbering or course titles:

- 4. The capstone course was given its own course number (changed from SLS 480P to SLS 485) to remove any potential confusion between the capstone course and other 480-alpha courses.
- 5. The numbering for Bilingual Education was changed from SLS 380 to SLS 408 to reflect the advanced level of the course. The course title was also changed to "Multilingual Education" to reflect changes in the current reality (particularly in Hawai`i)

Changes to the curriculum map:

- 6. The curriculum map was revised based on a review, done by the SLS BA Committee, of items required for the portfolio in the capstone course (SLS 485). The findings were:
  - SLO 5 is not covered in SLS 485; rather, it is mastered in SLS 490 (Second Language Testing). Artifacts can be taken from coursework done for SLS 490 to assess this SLO.
  - SLO 6 is not covered in SLS 485; rather, it is mastered in SLS 408 (Bilingual Education) and SLS 430 (Pidgin and Creole Englishes in Hawai`i). Artifacts can be taken from coursework done for SLS 408 and 430 to assess this SLO.
  - SLO 5 is reinforced in SLS 312 (Techniques in Second Language Teaching: Reading & Writing) and SLS 313 (Techniques in Second Language Teaching: Listening & Speaking).
- 7. The curriculum map was revised to include recently developed courses in SLS (SLS 130, 150, 218, 280, and 475).
