7 Forms of Assistance

<u>Modeling</u>- The process of offering behavior, language, and thought processes for imitation.

<u>Contingency Management</u>- The means of assistance whereby rewards and punishments are arranged to follow behavior, depending on whether or not the behavior is desired.

Feed-backing- The act of providing information on performance. For example, test data, instantaneous response to student's conversations, graded worksheets, etc.

Direct Instruction- Teachers assume responsibility for assisting performance and provide overt instruction, rather than expecting students to learn on their own.

<u>Questioning</u>- Asking questions to either *assess* or *assist* development and learning.

<u>Cognitive Structuring</u>- Refers to the provision of a structure for thinking and acting. It is an organizing structure that evaluates, groups, and sequences perception, memory, and action.

<u>**Task Sequencing</u>**- Breaking down a large task into smaller more manageable components.</u>
