

# **Counselor-In-Residence (CIR) Program Application Instructions**

Dear Applicant,

We are pleased to provide you with this information on our Counselor-In-Residence (CIR) program at the University of Hawai‘i at Mānoa. This is a jointly administered program between the Counseling and Student Development Center (CSDC) and the Student Housing Services (SHS). The CIR provides crisis counseling, consultation, and program development expertise to the staff and residents of our housing system.

This is a unique opportunity for our counselors and trainees to receive additional professional expertise on this rich multi-ethnic and multi-cultural campus. (Please review website for more details of the CIR program.) Compensation for services provided by the CIR include a one bedroom apartment within the Student Housing residence hall complex and a stipend of \$800 a month which is a great package to supplement the compensation offered at the CSDC. We presently employ five Counselors-In-Residence, which often includes interns.
