

## I-94 Record Retrieval Consent

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The Form I-94 record is issued by U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) officers to nonimmigrants arriving in the U.S. This record dictates and serves as evidence of a person's lawful immigration status in the U.S. Individuals arriving at U.S. air or sea ports will be given electronic I-94s, which can be retrieved at <http://i94.cbp.dhs.gov> by entering the following information into the web form: name, birth date, passport number, and passport-issuing country. See [www.cbp.gov/I94](http://www.cbp.gov/I94) for general information on the electronic I-94.

In many cases, it may be necessary for FSIS staff to access the I-94 records of exchange visitors and employees and their dependent family members directly from the CBP website. Therefore, each J-1 exchange visitor and E-3, H-1B, O-1, or TN employee sponsored by the University of Hawai'i (UH) must complete and submit this form along with the sponsoring department's immigration request packet to FSIS. By signing below, the exchange visitor/employee is designating FSIS staff as authorized representatives who may retrieve his/her and his/her dependents' I-94 records from the CBP website on their behalf. This consent will begin on the date FSIS receives the E-3, H-1B, J-1, O-1, or TN request packet and will terminate upon the expiration of UH immigration sponsorship.

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I authorize FSIS to access the I-94 records of myself and my dependent family members from the U.S. Customs and Border Protection website. I understand that this consent will begin on the date FSIS receives the initial immigration request packet from my UH sponsoring unit and will end when my UH-sponsored immigration status expires.
