- New Liaison Graduate Admissions Application in use
 - Outcomes – development is on-going; weekly meetings w/ Liaison & Outcomes
 - Customized program home pages on the application
 - **Projected:** Fall 2027 applications reviewed online; no more Supplemental Document System
- Graduate certificates – UH Mānoa is issuing official certificates as of spring 2024
 - Submit Graduation Application; no fee to be charged for GCERT completers
- Graduate Assistantships
 - Current minimum required step = Step 13; **as of Aug 1, 2025, Step 14**
 - Salary schedule revised (EP 5.223); max Step is 30
 - For any 0.25FTE GA consideration, approval from Graduate Division is required first

Reminders

- Check program graduate faculty list for accuracy – [Select Committee Member](#) page
 - Do all AGF members have a current AGF non-comp appt?
 - Do all faculty (new hires) in your program have a GF appt?
 - **UPDATE:** Title IX Training is required for all graduate faculty - **ANNUALLY**
- Enrollment required for ALL students
 - GAs – required minimum = 6 cr (unless eligible for 1 cr of 800 or 700F) –submit GATEX
 - Pending Form 2 – students should be registered in 699 while waiting
- Course scheduling: note online credit limits (49% or less) if program is not approved to be delivered fully online
 - Are you and colleagues engaged in thoughtful and advanced scheduling?
 - Has there been a review of all dept's courses in the Catalog for accuracy in advertisement?
 - Consider retiring courses (UHM-2) that have not been offered in at least 5 years

- Currently, 29* approved pathways; more are pending approval or to be submitted
 - *Of those, 24 are administered by Graduate Division

Check scheduling

- Double-counted courses – offered regularly?
- No time conflicts with required Bachelor's degree courses
- Program modification process for any changes

Send prospective BAM applicants and BAM graduates memo: GD, FAS, Registrar

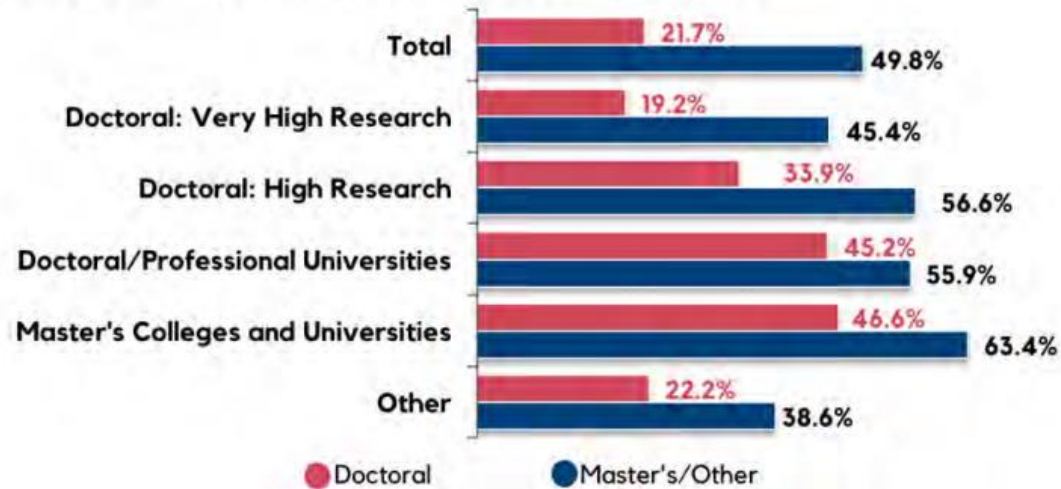

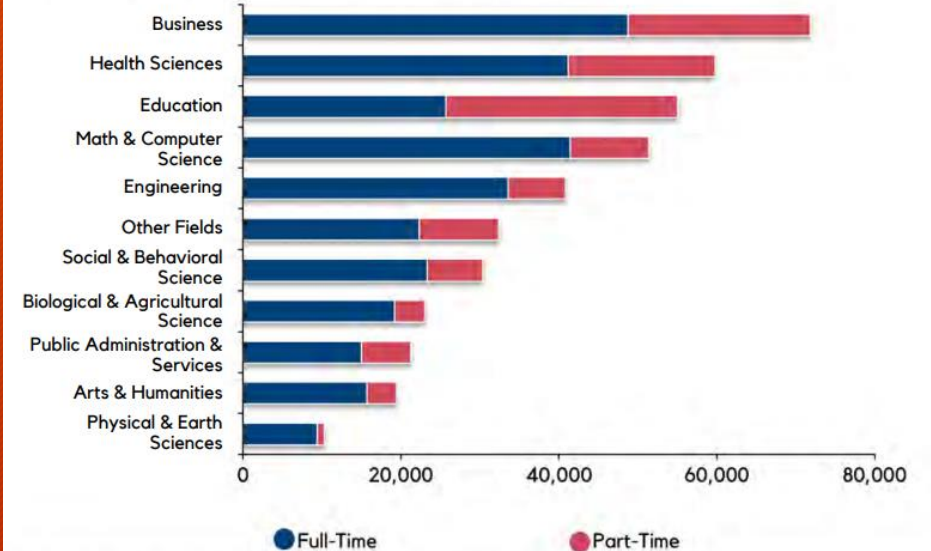

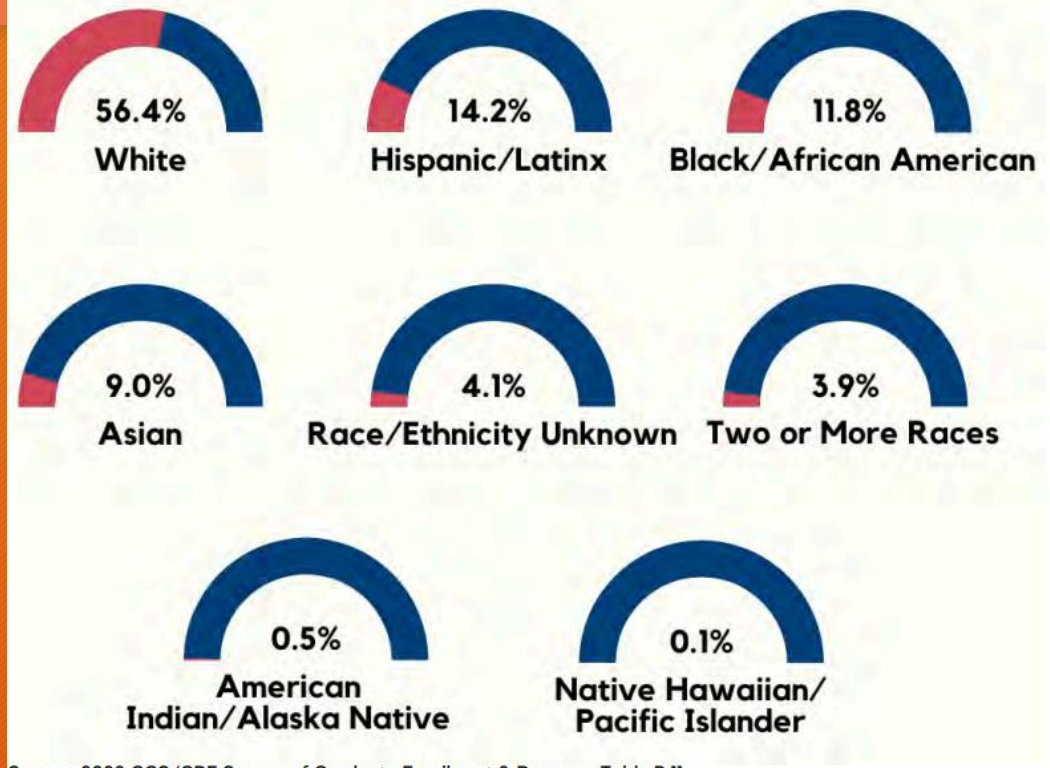

Enrollment by Race

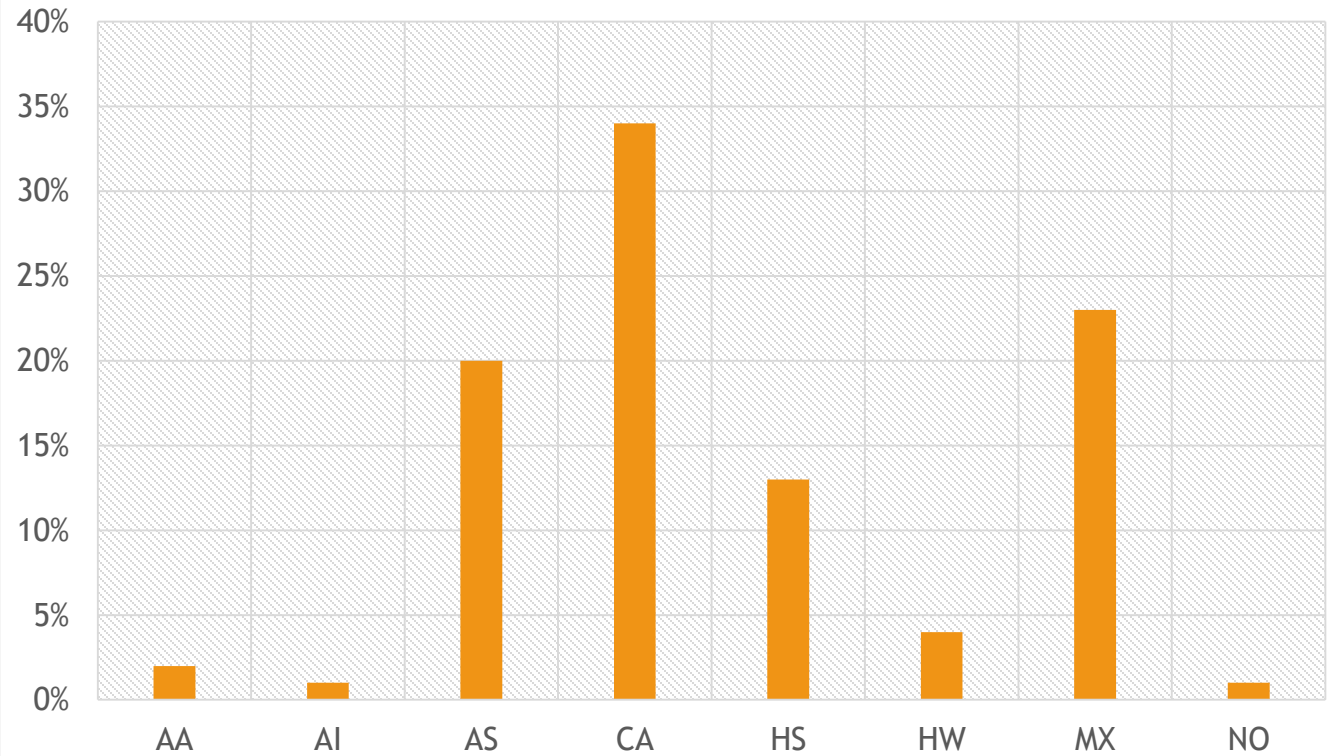
FIGURE 4. U.S. CITIZEN AND PERMANENT RESIDENT FIRST-TIME GRADUATE ENROLLMENT BY RACE/ETHNICITY. FALL 2022

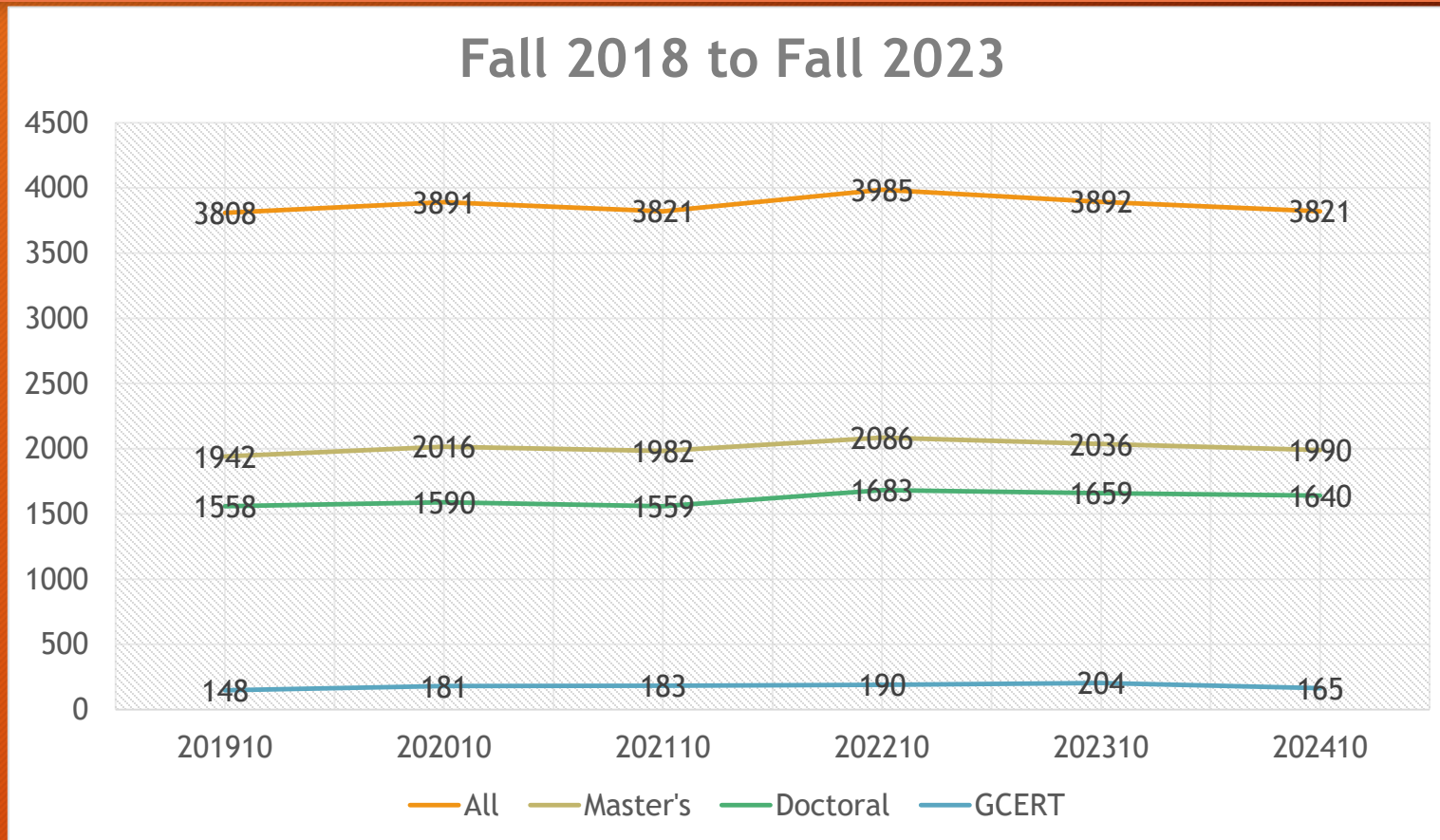

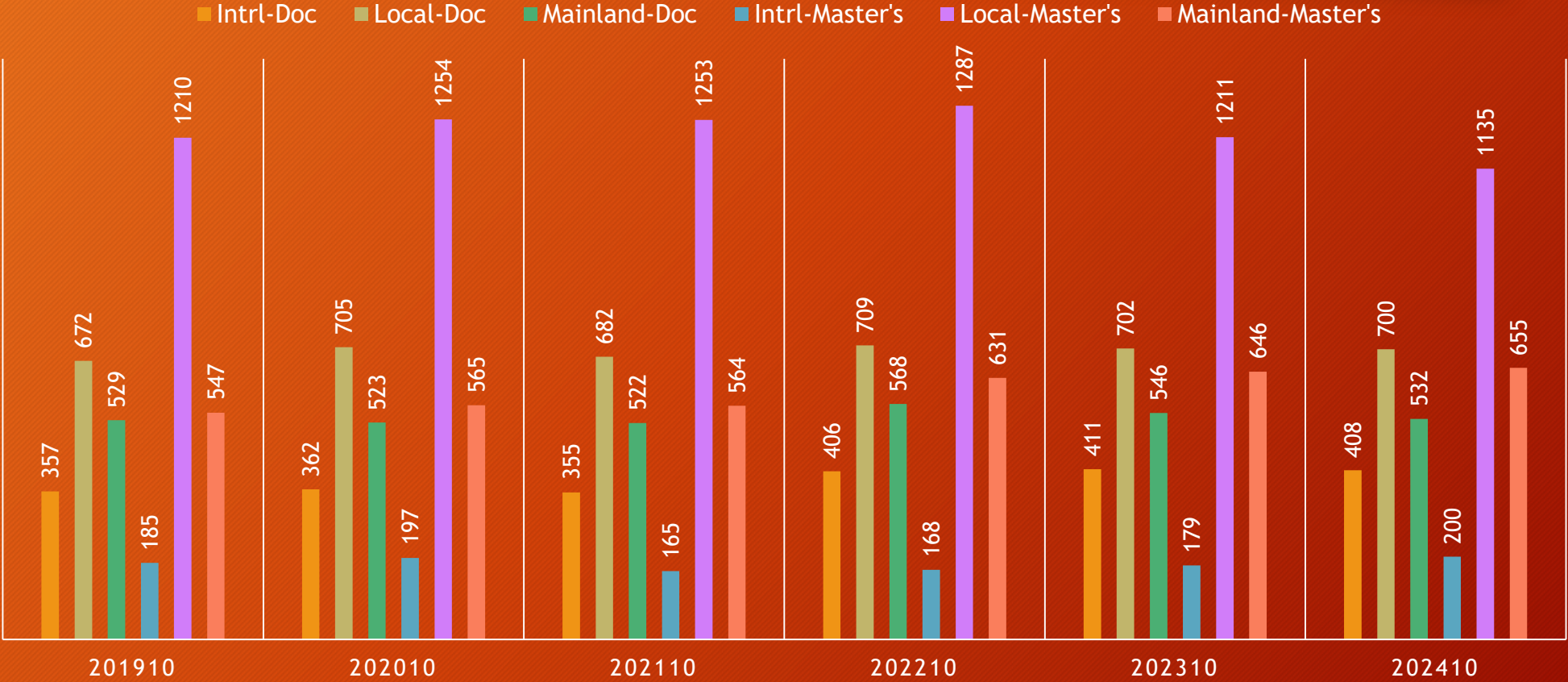

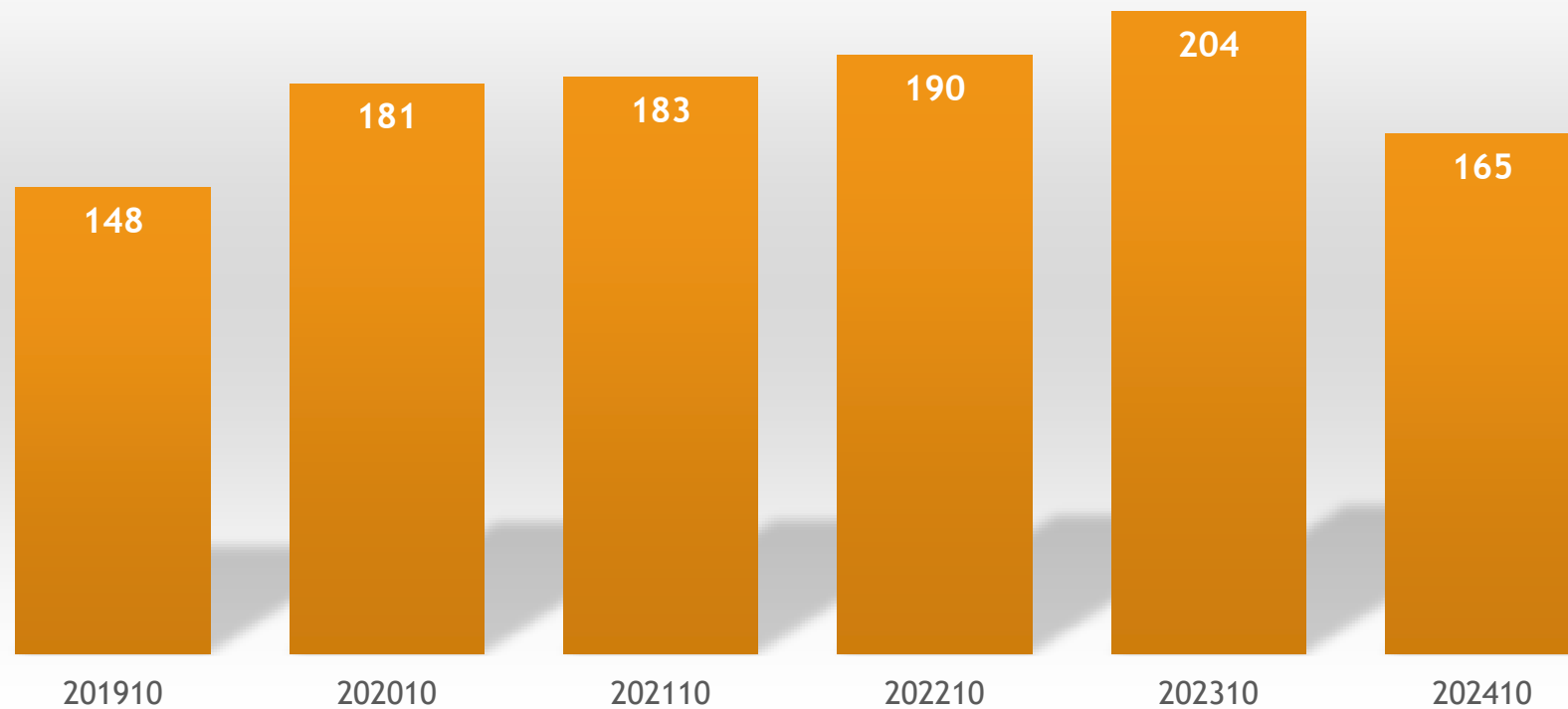
Enrollment trends - Doctoral and Master's Degrees



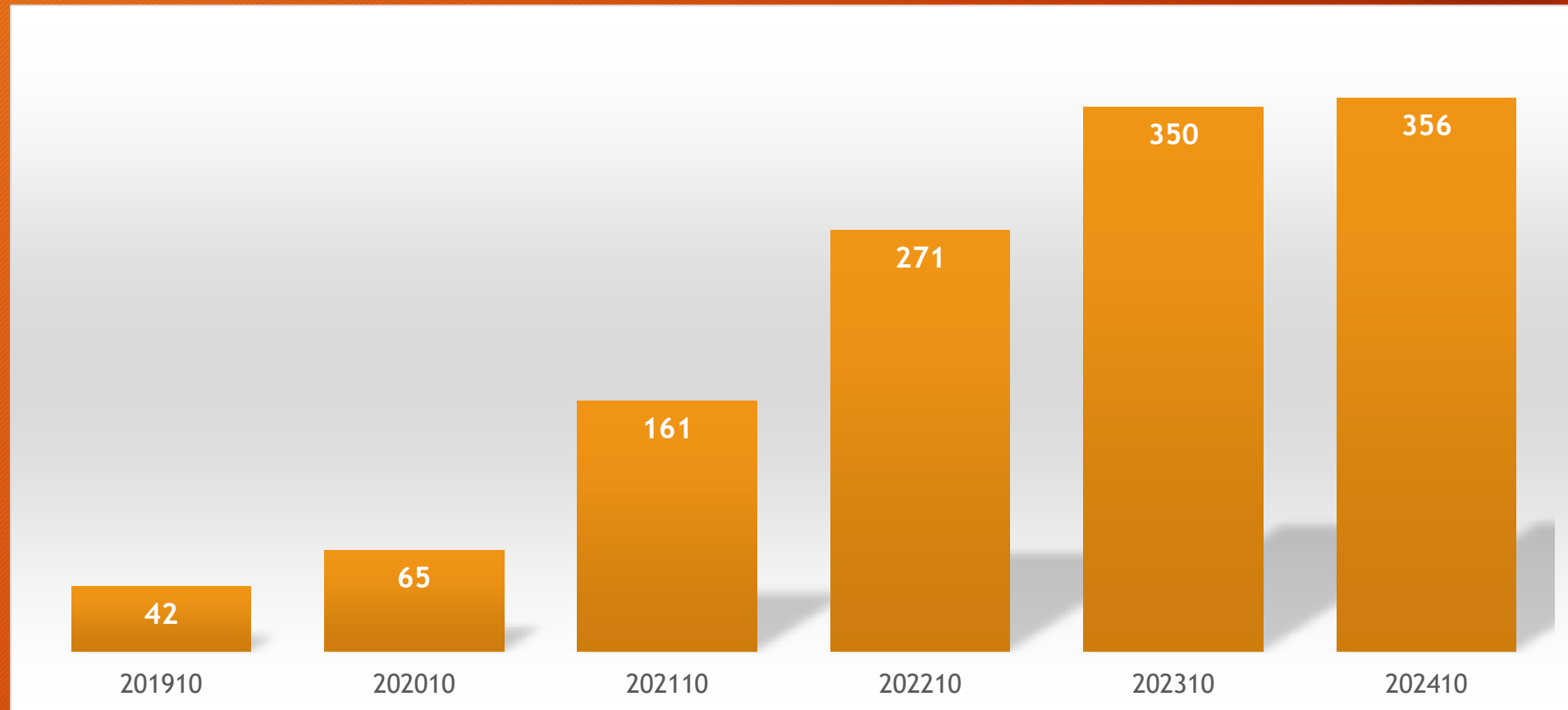
Enrollment: International, Local, Mainland: Fall 2018-2023

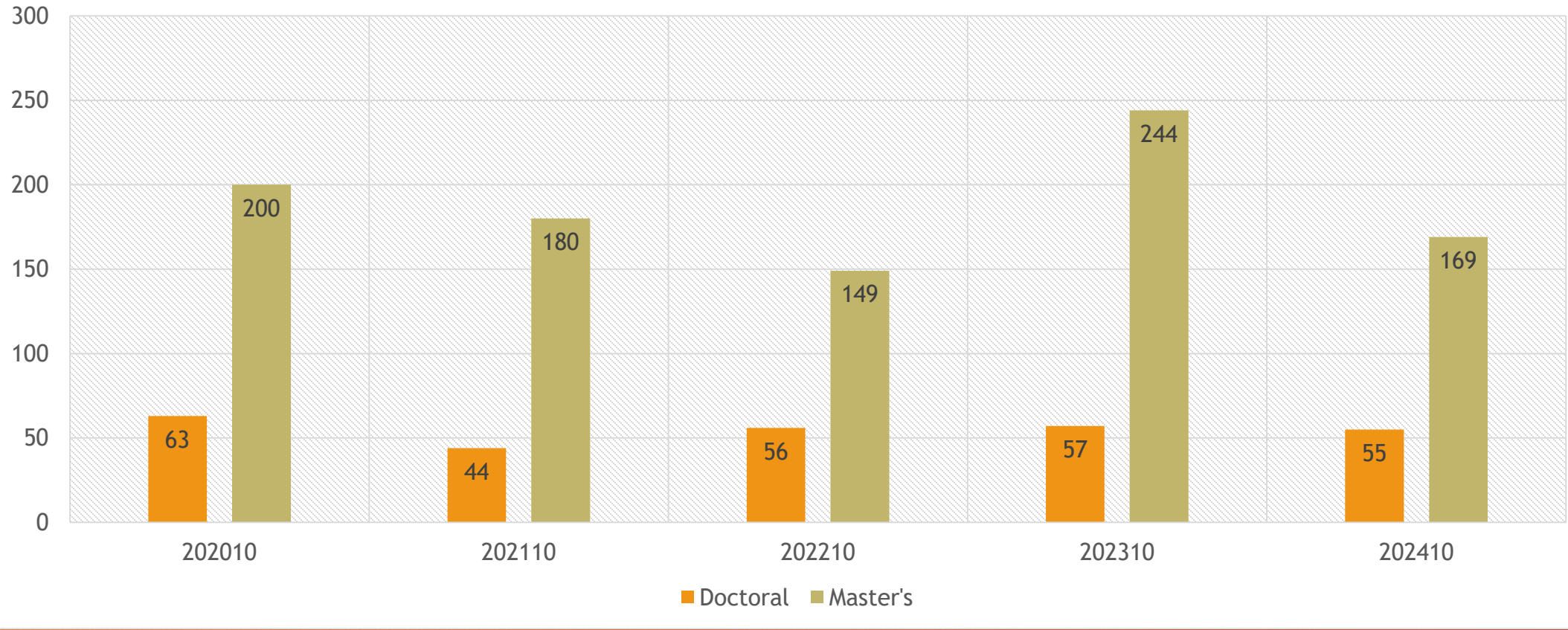




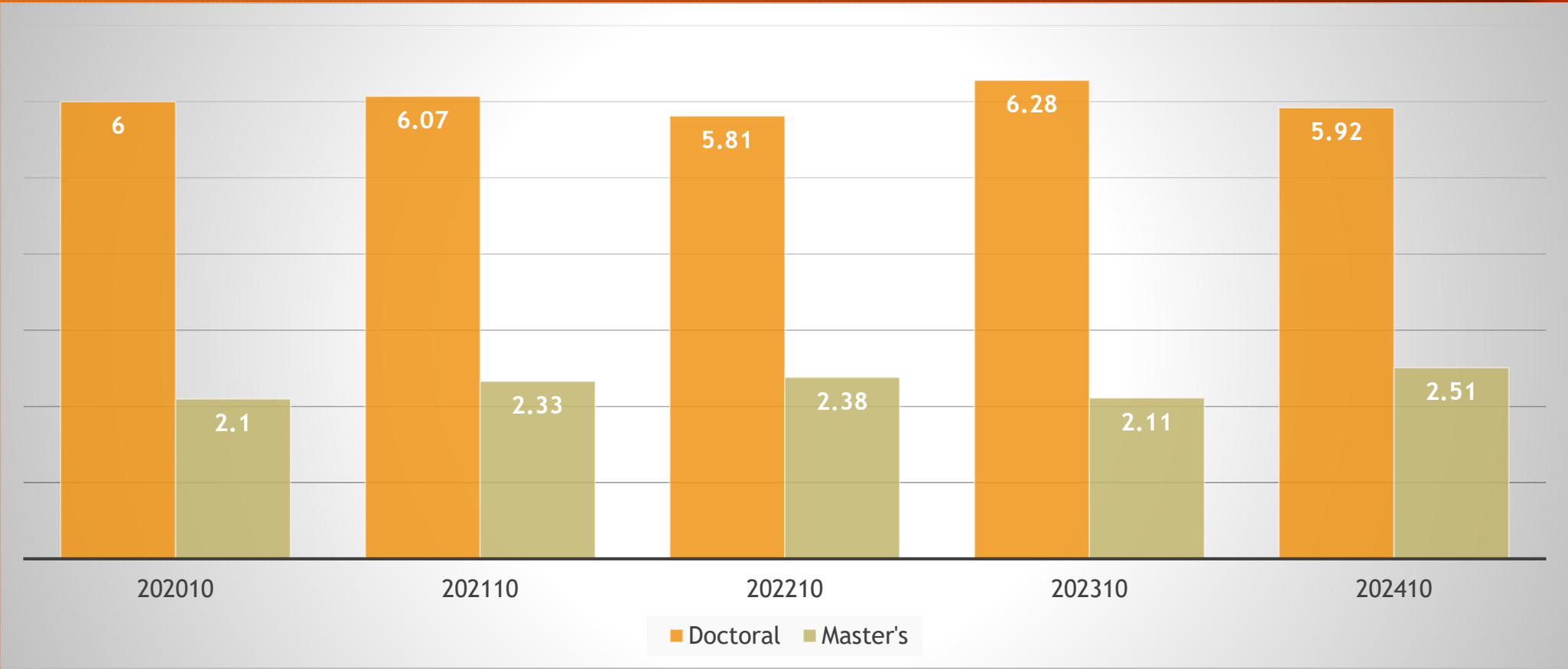
Graduation Patterns
