

## The Center for Disease Control's 1815 Project

### Background:

The purpose of the 1815 grant is to improve the health of Americans through the prevention and management of diabetes, heart disease, and stroke. HHIET provided technical assistance to the Chronic Disease Prevention and Health Promotion Division (CDPHPD) on both the Category A Report and the Category B Effectiveness Brief for Year 3 of the CDC 1815 project.

- Category A focuses on diabetes/prediabetes.
- Category B focuses on controlling hypertension.

### Technical Assistance Process:

HHIET participated in multiple meetings, engaged in regular email communication throughout the year, and collaborated with CDPHPD to align indicators with CDC reporting requirements by reviewing and revising current indicators to update the Evaluation and Performance Measurement Plan (EPMP). Additionally, HHIET met monthly with one of the implementing partners, Hawai'i Primary Care Association (HPCA), to develop a tool which assisted them with collecting information needed to fulfill their reporting deliverables for Category A. With the newly revised indicators for both Categories A and B, HHIET received quality data from all the implementing partners that were aligned with the end of year report that was submitted in September 2021. HHIET is confident that future reports in Years 4 and 5 will deliver the same high-quality data *via* the continuous collaboration and open communication with the CDPHPD and other partners receiving 1815 funds.
