Breast and Cervical Cancer Control Program (BCCCP)

The Breast and Cervical Cancer Control Program (BCCCP) offers low-income, uninsured women access to free or low-cost cancer screenings, including mammograms and Pap tests, to detect cancer early and improve outcomes.



HHET collaborated with the HDOH
Cancer Program to evaluate BCCCP
outreach strategies utilizing a descriptive
case study approach. This process evaluation aimed to
better understand how DOH grantees successfully
engage women in BCCCP services.



The Evaluation Team worked with the Kōkua Kalihi Valley (KKV) Comprehensive Family Services BCCCP team to conduct the evaluation study.

Methods

- Developed a data collection protocol and semi-structured interview guide to gather detailed information on outreach strategies from BCCCP staff
- Collected and reviewed relevant documents and data to support staff insights
- Conducted a group interview with four key BCCCP staff at KKV

Outputs



HHET analyzed the data and wrote a **Success Story** to be submitted to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in support of grant requirements. The success story highlighted the significant impact of community outreach workers in **building trust and increasing access** to essential cancer screenings for underserved women. Staff emphasized the **importance of ongoing community outreach**, **addressing barriers through culturally centered care**, **expanding outreach efforts**, **and strengthening trust** within the community. This was submitted to the CDC.

A brief **Summary Report** of other key findings was also shared with the Cancer Program and KKV to provide an overview of the **challenges**, **successes**, **and ongoing efforts** related to BCCCP outreach.
