### 3. Biographical / Historical Note

Date	Event
1879	Arthur Lynn Becker (Korean name 백아덕) born to a poor farmer family in Michigan, oldest of four siblings (oldest to youngest: Arthur, Leonard, Lulu, Ralph)
1903	Graduated from Albion College with a BA in Physics
1903	Arrived in Pyongyang for missionary work as an American Methodist missionary. After being ordained as an elder (장로) pastor by Bishop D.H. Moore, he was appointed to the Pyongyang region
1903	Taught mathematics, chemistry, physics, and trigonometry at the Pyongyang Academy (평양 아카데미), which was established by Presbyterians and Methodists
1907	Took on the role of Physics and Math professor at Pyongyang Soongsil Academy (평양송실 학당). Assisted in the building of the Soongsil Science Hall (송실과학관)
1909	Became a faculty member of Union Christian College
1911	Graduated with a master's degree in chemistry at University of Michigan, Ann Arbor
1914	Assisted H.G. Underwood, O.R. Avison, E.H. Miller and others in establishing Chosen Christian College at the Yeonhui Technical College, (연희전문학교, current Yonsei University), sponsored by the Presbyterian and Methodist Churches. Participated as the founding director of Yeonhui Technical College (연희전문학교, current Yonsei University), and at the same time, served as the school's student affairs manager from the beginning under the Principal of Underwood College (current undergraduate college of Yonsei University)
1914.4	In charge of the Paichai School's (배재 학당) newly integrated "Temporary University Preparatory School" (임시대학예과) in Jeongdong (정동), Seoul, as vice principal, in charge of practical affairs at the school, established the foundation for science education
1918	Taught at the Wonsan Summer Korean and Japanese Language School
1919	Informed Nebraska Senator Norris of the March 1st Movement (3.1 운동) and his article was published in the Senate minutes
1921	Graduated with a Ph.D. in chemistry from University of Michigan, Ann Arbor
1922-1941	Served as the head of the combined Mathematics and Physics department (수물학과), director, academic director, and vice principal at Yeonhui

	Technical College. Principal at Sogang University in 1931, member of the Budget and Property Committee, Chosen Christian College, in 1936
1942	Forced deportation from Joseon (current Korea) by Japanese colonial rule during the Pacific War (태평양전쟁, part of WWII)
1944	Staff Sponsor of Astronomy Club, Lucknow Christian College, Lucknow
1946	Served as a board member of Yeonhui Technical College's transitional board of directors after returning to Korea post-liberation
1946.8	Appointed President of Pusan National University, the first National university to be established by the Ministry of Culture and Education, with the recommendation of Yoo Eok Gyeom (유억겸), the head of the U.S. military government's education department and Minister of Education at the time
1947	Completed his work in Korea and returned to America, awarded as Honorary Teacher of Korea from Korea National Department of Education
1948.3	Executive Secretary of Korean Cultural Relations Association
1949	Retires after returning to America
1961	Wife Louise Becker passed away
1978.12.21	Arthur Lynn Becker passed away

## 5. Scope and Content Note

The papers of Arthur Lynn Becker span the years 1879-1978, with the bulk of the material concentrated in the 1900s, dominantly in the form of daily diary entries of when Becker was abroad as a missionary in both Korea and India. These records relate to the Methodist Missionary Education System in Korea and India, and Becker's role as a teacher and school leader abroad. The Arthur Lynn Becker papers constitute an important first person view of both the Japanese occupation in Korea, and the rebuilding of the country post-occupation. Becker's papers include documents relating to his daughter, Evelyn Becker McCune, whose collection is also available at the University of Hawaii at Manoa's Center for Korean Studies. The collection consists of Becker's **Correspondences, Collected Works, and Personal Works**.

Arthur Becker's **Correspondences** consists of letters and telegrams written to his family, fellow missionaries, and many correspondences between him and the Board of Foreign Missions, Methodist Episcopal Church, New York, NY.

Arthur Becker's **Collected Works** consist of newspaper clippings and pamphlets relating to Korean current events, national current events, and global current events. There are also a vast amount of newspaper clippings from student-run college publications, and pamphlets from various visits to different universities and institutions.

Arthur Becker's **Personal Works** consists of his original typed and copied daily diary entries of the following:
