“Refloating the Oglala. Salvage work on the Oglala. The ship was raised by means of huge pontoons which were first sunk, then hooked to the vessel and slowly raised. Compared to the work of raising the battleships sunk on December 7, this job was a ‘minor’ one for Pearl Harbor war workers.”

Pearl Harbor never closes: throughout the evening and night, and into the early hours of the morning, ships come and go and repair work goes on and on. Only when the bright Hawaiian sun goes down and the Navy Yard is cloaked in the purple mantle of evening does the sheer beauty of this great island industrial base become apparent. And if that is a little too corny for our Pearl Harbor mechanics and shipbuilders, we'll simply say that this is a pretty picture and let it go at that.
