The Exercise

- Why would or wouldn't you use these sources in a paper for English 100?

1. First Pair

Using one laptop on your table,

- Using *OneSearch*, find and view the ebook *diamonds : an early history of the king of gems*
- On the results screen, click on **Available Online**

Using the other laptop,

- Google: *who needs a ring to propose when there are puppies and paintings*

- Google: *University of Hawaii at Manoa Library Website*
- Using *OneSearch*, find and view the article: *how do I love thee joanna slater*
