Mānoa, just outside downtown Honolulu, on the island of O'ahu

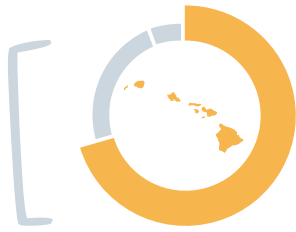

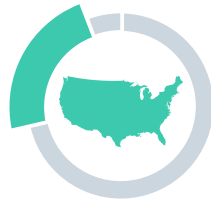

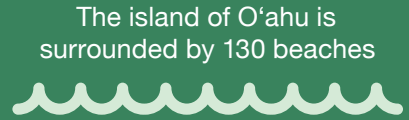
