# University of Hawai'i at Mānoa Office of Multicultural Student Services and The Office of Vice President for University of Hawai'i Community Colleges

Pasefika Passion Pipeline (3P) is a collaborative effort between UH Manoa-Office of Multicultural Students Services and Office of Vice President for UH Community Colleges (UHCC). The main goal of this program is to increase the recruitment of non-Native Hawaiian Pacific Islanders (non-NHPI) in the State of Hawaii, to pursue learning at any UHCC. We also provide support for retention and transfer strategies once our students begin their college education at a UHCC.

In the summer of 2018, 3P and Kapi'olani Community College (KCC) will offer a **FREE** 3-credit summer class for non-NHPI high school seniors who would like to register and pursue a college education at KCC in fall 2019. This 3-credit summer class is **Interdisciplinary Studies 107 (IS 107)** and will be held at KCC from June 3rd - July 5th, 2019 (Mon-Fri, 8:00 am - 3:00 pm). To be considered for this program, students must complete an online admissions application and be accepted to KCC. Students must also complete and submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). 3P staff are available to assist in the completion of both online admissions and FAFSA applications, if need be. Furthermore, students will be paired up with a peer mentor that will support them during the summer bridge program as well as the 2019-2020 academic year.

Once students complete and submit their online admission application to KCC, 3P staff will follow-up with KCC regarding the status of their admission application. Students accepted into the 3P 3-credit free summer class will be asked to attend a group meeting that will cover the goals and expectations of the 3-credit college class. Parents are strongly encouraged to attend this meeting so they are also aware of the need for them to support their son or daughter in their pursuit of learning in college.

### **DEADLINE**

Students must submit the online admission application to Kapi'olani CC at www.kapiolani.hawaii.edu. For the FAFSA application please complete and submit it online at https://fafsa.ed.gov. Both applications must be submitted online as soon as possible or by **Friday, May 3, 2019**.
