Applicants who have completed an articulated A.A. degree from a UH Community College are considered to have met the UHM General Education Core Requirements with possible exceptions (see an academic advisor). Completion of 50% of the coursework in the academic major is required prior to admissions to the Licensure Track. PRAXIS I (PPST/C-PPST): Minimal state passing scores in reading, writing, and mathematics subtests. 40 hours of documented current group leadership involvement with secondary-aged youth. Personal admissions interview. Applicants majoring in Hawaiian Language are required to schedule an additional Personal Admissions Interview.
