#### **Licensure Track Admission Requirements**

- Fall and Spring admission.
- Submit an application no later than the following:
  - o **March 1** for fall semester (Feb 1 priority deadline)
  - September 1 for spring semester (Aug 1 priority deadline)
- 2.75 cumulative GPA in all post-secondary institutions
- 2.75 cumulative GPA in academic major
- 55 credits
- Completion of all UHM General Education Core and any additional Pre-Admissions Requirements.
- Applicants who have completed an articulated A.A. degree from a UH Community College are considered to have met the UHM General Education Core Requirements with possible exceptions (see an academic advisor).
- Completion of 50% of the coursework in the broad distribution and 50% of the coursework in the academic major are required prior to admission to the Licensure Track
- PRAXIS I (PPST/C-PPST): Minimal state passing scores in reading, writing, and mathematics subtests.
- 40 hours of documented current group leadership involvement with secondary-aged youth.
- Personal admissions interview.

- 2.75 cumulative GPA or higher
- 2.75 GPA or higher in the major
