#### **Licensure Track Admission Requirements**

- Spring admission.
- Submit an application no later than the following:
  - October 1 for spring semester (Sept 1 priority deadline)
- 2.75 cumulative GPA in all post-secondary institutions
- 2.75 cumulative GPA in academic major
- 55 credits
- Completion of all UHM General Education Core and any additional Licensure Track Prerequisites.
- Applicants who have completed an articulated A.A. degree from a UH Community College are considered to have met the UHM General Education Core Requirements with possible exceptions (see an academic advisor).
- Completion of 50% of the coursework in the broad distribution and 50% of the coursework in the academic major are required prior to admission to the Licensure Track.
- 40 hours of documented current group leadership involvement with secondary-aged youth.
- · Personal admissions interview.
