Social Justice and Diversities Upper Division Electives

BSW students must complete seven (7) courses totaling twenty-one (21) credits in five (5) broad focus areas. The Upper Division Electives are organized around a social justice and diversity framework informed by the core values of the social work profession. Students are to take one (1) course each in the U.S. Experience; Social Dynamics and Group Interaction; Politics, Government, & Economies; and Research focus areas. Student must also take three (3) courses totaling nine (9) credits in Diversities-focused classes.

- *The U.S. Experience – Comparatively examines the myth and realit(ies) of the United States as a unified and singular culture emphasizing points of assimilation, adaptation, contestation, and resistance (U.S. Exp).*
- *Social Dynamics and Group Interaction – Focuses on the role of social interaction at the mezzo and macro levels particularly as it relates to social functioning and change (Soc Dynamics).*
- *Politics, Government, & Economies – Examines the real or imagined nation state and the governmental, political, and economic structures particularly as it balances the needs of a given people (Politics).*
- *Research – Expanded knowledge on program evaluation and statistics (Research).*
- *Diversities – Students take courses in at least three (3) different “diversity” based courses. Examples include, but are not limited to: age, class, color, culture, indigeneity, ability, ethnicity, gender, gender identity and expression, immigration status, political ideology, race, religion, sex, and sexual orientation (Diversities).*
