- Accelerated MATH 111/112 courses may be available to complete in one semester. Consult an academic counselor/advisor.

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University of Hawai'i at Mānoa Transfer Admission Requirements

24 transferable semester credits or 12 transferable semester credits completed and have at least 12 transferable semester credits in progress

Cumulative transfer GPA: 2.0 for residents; 2.5 for non-residents

If you do not have 24 transferable credits, admission will be based on both your college and high school work.

UH-Mānoa Admission Deadlines

January 5	Fall semester applications due for international applicants and for priority consideration.
March 1	All Fall admission applications due
September 1	Spring semester applications due for international applicants and for priority consideration
October 1	All spring admission applications due
