The Department of Ethnic Studies (ES) is an interdisciplinary program with emphasis on undergraduate education. Initiated in 1970, ES combines traditional and contemporary methodologies with new perspectives on issues of race, ethnicity, class, and gender. The focus is Hawai'i and Oceania with the rich legacy of multiethnic heritages, but the research, teaching and service components also involve the U.S. as a whole and comparative studies of societies around the globe.

Graduates have gone on to successful careers in education, social work, law, public service, labor and community organizing, and other fields that require an understanding of diverse people and their backgrounds.

University of Hawai'i at Mānoa Transfer Admission Requirements:

- 24 transferable semester credits or 12 transferable semester credits completed and have at least 12 transferable semester credits in progress
- Cumulative transfer GPA: 2.0 for residents; 2.5 for non-residents
- If you do not have 24 transferable credits, admission will be based on both your college and high school work.

January 5	Fall semester applications due for international applicants and for priority consideration
March 1	All fall admission applications due
September 1	Spring semester applications due for international applicants and for priority consideration
October 1	All spring admission applications due
